Regent's College occupies 12 acres of land in the heart of Regent's Park in Central London. The College currently has 2,000 students and a total of 490 staff. It enjoys a strong financial position generating a surplus of more than £1 million on a £25 million turnover. It has an international, multicultural and plurilingual student body drawn from over 85 different countries and works in partnership with more than 150 institutions around the world, with staff and student exchanges and a variety of study abroad programmes.

Regent's College is a private, charitable, higher education institution. It encompasses The European Business School London, Regent's Business School London, The Regent's American College London, The School of Psychotherapy and Counselling Psychology and The Webster Graduate School London. A new school of Film, Media and Performance is to be launched.

The College receives no direct funding from government. As a charity and a company it is bound by both company law and the requirement to operate within the legislation set down in the Charities Act 2006. In particular, it must operate within the boundaries of its memorandum and articles of association and must contribute to public benefit.

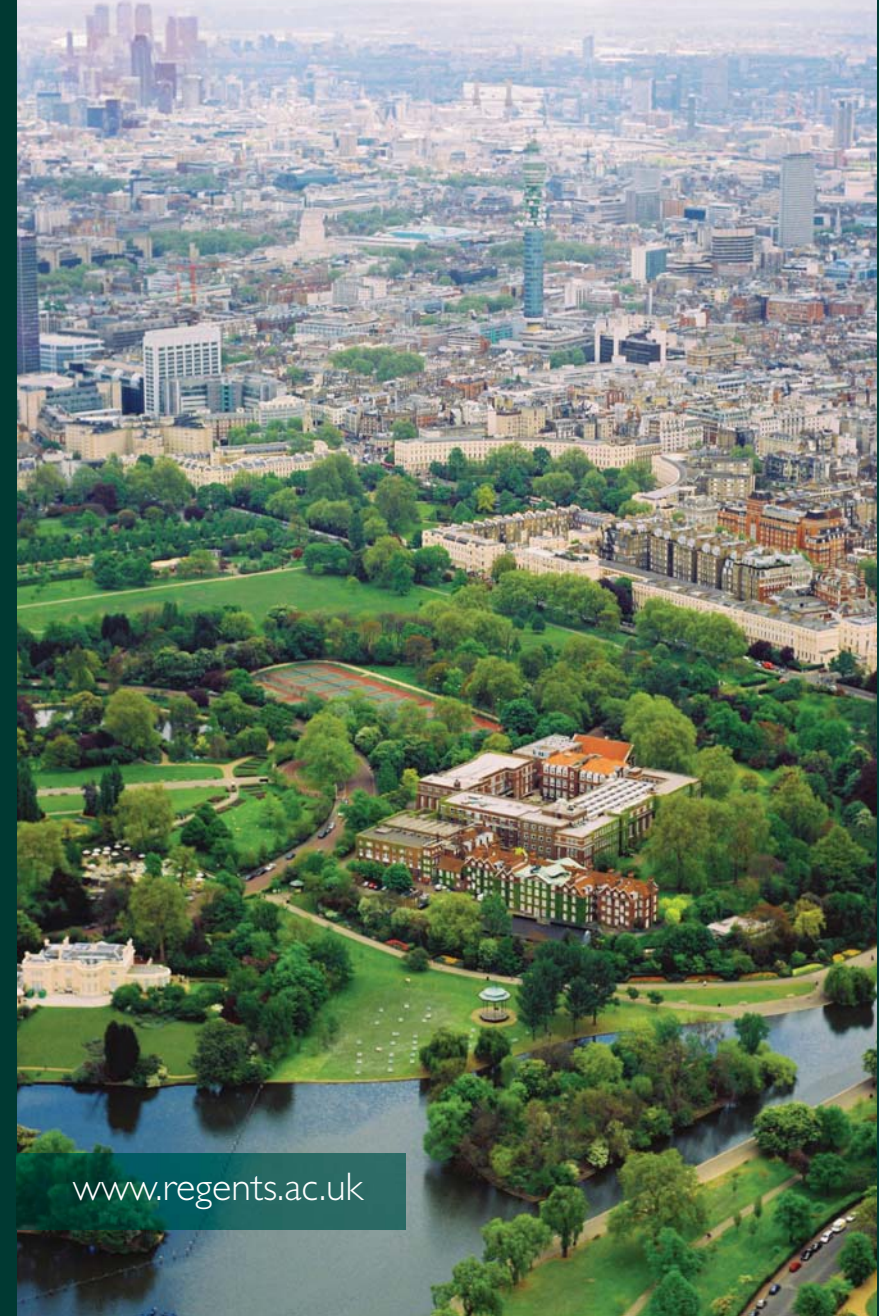
Following the appointment of a new Chief Executive the College is undertaking a major reorganisation of its academic and administrative structures in preparation for seeking Taught Degree Awarding Powers.

The academic structure is based around two new Faculties each lead by a new Dean – The Dean of Business and Management and the Dean of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences.

Until June 2006 the College effectively operated as a supplier of space and services to a number of private academic schools:

- **European Business School London**
- **Regent's Business School London**
- **Regent's American College London**
- **The School of Psychotherapy and Counselling Psychology**
- **Webster Graduate School London**

The schools offer Higher Education programmes validated by a variety of British and American Universities including the Open University, the University of Wales, Bournemouth University and City University. American undergraduate and postgraduate programmes are also offered from Webster University of St Louis, Missouri, USA.
