






Regent's is London's only independent, not-for-profit university, with a highly cosmopolitan community, based in royal Regent's Park and Marylebone.



Mixing with just under 4,000 students on campus, at Regent's you will never be just another face in the crowd.






A short walk away from the campus is Marylebone Village, a lively historical area, known for its up-market boutiques, cafés and designer shops.












Reid Hall

General and Business English

Monday - Friday 09:15-12:30 and 13:30-15:00 (22.5 hours per week)

An intensive course combining General English in the mornings (see left) with English for Business classes in the afternoons. English for Business sessions cover essential skills such as presentations, negotiations, job applications and interviews, business correspondence, work meetings and telephone English.

English level: B1+/B2 level. Applicants are offered a short Skype interview to confirm their level of English. No business experience is required.

Pre-sessional Course

This course is designed for students who currently hold an offer for a degree programme at Regent's University London, or any other UK based institution.

It provides an overview of academic culture in the UK, develops general and academic English and explores different types of academic assessment.

Upon successful completion of the course, students can progress directly to their chosen degree programme at Regent's, provided they have met the entry requirements.

The full course lasts 24 weeks but students can join at later stages, depending on their English language level and needs.

Students on the 24 and 20 week course start from 8 or 4 weeks of Intensive English respectively in order to improve their overall English language level before they move on to academic English content. The schedule of Intensive English is 9:15 – 12:30 and 13:30 – 15:00 (22.5 hours per week).

IELTS Exam Preparation

An academic course for students who wish to develop their skills and take the IELTS examination.

IELTS is a widely accepted qualification for university entrance internationally.

The course builds students' confidence in reading, writing. listening, speaking and vocabulary.

Students develop their understanding of exam techniques and strategies for each of the exam components while developing their general English skills.

Students sit an official IELTS exam on campus at the end of the course (subject to availability).

English plus Internship

This course helps students to accelerate their English language skills and improve their career prospects.

Students attend the Intensive English course (minimum 8 weeks) which is followed by a work placement in a London-based company (minimum 4 weeks). The duration of the programme is flexible. See page 12 for enrolment dates.

The Intensive English language course helps you to improve all your skills (reading, writing, listening, speaking) as well as grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation.

After completing the course, you will move on to a work placement in a London-based company where you put the knowledge and skills you have gained into practice.

We offer the placements in a wide range of sectors, including marketing, business administration, event management, hospitality and tourism, as well as specialist areas such as engineering, finance, architecture, film and TV production, fashion design, HR and software development.



We look forward to welcoming you to Regent's University London. Our campus in Regent's Park and specialist facilities in Marylebone are a short walk from each other and are easily accessible by public and private transport.

By Underground

Take the London Underground (Tube) to Baker Street station. To help plan your journey, use the Transport for London Journey Planner at www.tfl.gov.uk

From Baker Street station

Take the Marylebone Road exit. Turn left and walk past Madame Tussauds to York Gate on your left.

For the Regent's Park campus, turn left into York Gate. Continue over the bridge into the park. The University entrance is on the left. Total journey time approximately 10 minutes.

For the Marylebone site, cross the road at the traffic lights at York Gate. Turn left and then first right into Marylebone High Street. For the entrance to the Paddington Street building, turn right into Paddington Street. For the accessible entrance in Garbutt Place, turn right into Moxon Street, then right into Garbutt Place. Total journey time approximately 10 minutes.

By road

Both sites are off the A501 (Marylebone Road) in central London.

From London Heathrow Airport

Heathrow Express train service to Paddington station. London Underground from Paddington to Baker Street station. Total journey time approximately 35 minutes.

From London Gatwick Airport

Gatwick Express train service to Victoria station. London Underground from Victoria to Baker Street station. Total journey time approximately 60 minutes.

From London City Airport

Docklands Light Railway (DLR) to Canning Town station. London Underground from Canning Town to Baker Street station. Total journey time approximately 45 minutes.

From St Pancras International

From Eurostar terminal, London Underground from King's Cross St Pancras to Baker Street station. Total journey time approximately 10 minutes.
