Activities

You will be studying and staying in a great world city and of course, the social aspect of being at Regent's is just as important as the academic!

The programme includes a wide range of cultural and social activities to encourage you to explore this most cosmopolitan city and beyond. We have put together a packed programme of sight-seeing, with day trips to places such as Oxford, Cambridge and Stonehenge, West End theatres, historic London walks and more.

Alongside your studies, you will have plenty of time to discover one of the most interesting, vibrant cities in the world.

London has it all – theatre, fashion, arts, history and sport. With our world-famous underground train system (the Tube), you are moments away from some of the world's best-known historical buildings – Westminster Abbey, Buckingham Palace and the Tower of London.

You will also be close to London's many museums and art galleries - the National Gallery, British Museum and others - which offer endless opportunities to extend your cultural learning beyond the classroom.

Campus

Our beautiful campus is located in Regent's Park - one of the city's royal parks. From here, you can walk to London Zoo, explore the canal-side markets and cafés of Camden and see the waxworks at Madame Tussauds.

You are also just a walk away from the up-market shops on Marylebone High Street, Regent Street and Oxford Street.

As well as enjoying your immediate surroundings, you will be ideally placed to explore all that London has to offer. The Regent's campus is very close to Baker Street Underground station with its many Tube lines, so you are no more than 20 minutes away from most of London's main attractions.

The campus facilities include a large library, an IT centre with free internet and wifi access across campus, a restaurant, brasserie and a sports pitch.

Accommodation

Reid Hall is the stately north wing of Regent's, looking out over the lake and surrounding park. It provides on-campus accommodation minutes from all the amenities. The hall of residence houses 210 students in single*, twin and triple rooms.

Rooms are furnished with a bed, night stand, wardrobe, desk, chair and study lamp

Twin and triple rooms are furnished with two and three beds

Fresh linen is provided weekly

There is a pantry with a kettle, sink and microwave on each floor

Single-sex bathrooms are located on the corridors of each floor

There is a coin-operated laundrette

Wifi internet access is available throughout the residence

Students have swipe-card access to the building and a key to their individual room

A member of staff is on duty at the front desk 24 hours a day

A member of the Student Services team also lives in the Hall

*Single rooms are available to students aged 18+ only. A single supplement applies.

- Social activities:
 - > One full-day excursion weekly (out of London, transport included)
 - > Afternoon trips to London sights (by public transport, transport fare not included)

 - > Staff support 24/7, with a member of staff on duty in the hall of residence every day of the week
