## 1. Module description

Develop an enjoyment of theatre arts by going behind the scenes of theatre production. By understanding the mechanism of staging productions, from Shakespeare to musical theatre, you will start to appreciate the complexity of such collaborative projects, and begin to recognise the teamwork that realises them. Classroom activities will give you a taste of the discipline, intellectual demands and the craft and skills that shape a performance. You will learn the importance of collaborative contribution, critical thinking and innovation through digital technology in the arts.

## 2. Learning outcomes

#### 3. Learning and teaching methods

Short presentations will introduce you to the historical contexts and artistic conventions of theatre, from the ancient Greeks to contemporary forms. Practical studio explorations of scenes from diverse plays offer experience of how plays are staged and performed, and the roles of director, designer and actor. You will engage in performing these scenes to experience the actor/audience relationship. Through self-guided research and theatre visits, you will learn about the creative elements and collaborations required for fully-staged theatre productions.
