

The admission of students to an Integrated Foundation course (sponsored at Level 6)

The minimum entry requirement for Level 3 students is:

- One of the following qualifications:
 - Five GCSEs at grade A-C or equivalent or Grade 5 average
 - US High School Year 11 with a minimum GPA of 2.3/4.0
 - International Baccalaureate Year 1 with a minimum of 24 points
 - Equivalent qualifications as deemed acceptable by the University and set out in the Admissions Guide and UK ENIC.

Applicants who do not meet our A-Level/International Baccalaureate requirements will be considered for the Level 3 course

The admission of students to an Undergraduate course Business, Liberal Arts, Psychology

The minimum entry requirement for Level 4 students is:

- One of the following qualifications:
 - Three GCE A-levels in grades A-C
 - 24 points in the International Baccalaureate
 - US High School Diploma with a minimum GPA of 2.5, PLUS one of the following:
 - Three AP tests with an average grade of 3, or two with an average grade of 4
 - SAT: score of 1100 (550+ in both subjects)
 - ACT with a composite score of 26 (20 in each section)
 - Dual Enrolment and College credits (Year 1) – 30 credits with a GPA of 2.5+
 - Equivalent qualifications as deemed acceptable by the University and set out in the Admissions Guide and UK ENIC.

The minimum entry requirement for Level 4 students is:

- One of the following qualifications:
 - Two GCE A-levels in grades A-C
 - 24 points in the International Baccalaureate
 - US High School Diploma with a minimum GPA of 2.5, PLUS one of the following:
 - Two AP tests with an average grade of 3
 - SAT: score of 1000 (500+ in both subjects)
 - ACT with a composite score of 23 (20 in each section)
 - Dual Enrolment and College credits (Year 1) - 30 credits with a GPA of 2.5+
 - Equivalent qualifications as deemed acceptable by the University and set out in the Admissions Manual and UK NARIC

The admission of students to a Postgraduate course (including MProf)

The minimum entry requirement for Level 7 students is:

- One of the following qualifications:
 - Minimum second-class UK undergraduate degree
 - Equivalent international qualifications as deemed acceptable by Admissions and UK ENIC.

Exceptional entry will be assessed on a case-by-case basis by academic referral only based on:

- An undergraduate degree lower than 2:2 plus
 - No Level 6 qualifications but three years of relevant work experience (except MSc Psychology).

Introductory certificate in psychotherapy and counselling
Two references (one academic, two work experience)
Successfully passing an interview
CV

Two references (one academic, two work experience)

The admission of students to a Postgraduate course (excluding MProf)

Foundation Certificate

The minimum entry requirement is:

- Letter of recommendation
- CV listing professional, academic and voluntary history
- Minimum English language requirement for applicants from non-majority English-speaking countries is IELTS 7.0/6.0 (or equivalent).

PGCert Existential Psychotherapy and PGCert Integrative Psychotherapy

The minimum entry requirement is:

- CV (for external applicants)
- Two letters of recommendation
- Completion of MA Psychotherapy and Counselling or equivalent
- Successfully passing an interview
- Minimum English language requirement for applicants from non-majority English-speaking countries is IELTS 7.0/6.0 (or equivalent).

Applicants who have completed Regent's MA Psychotherapy and Counselling during the preceding academic year are exempted from providing a personal statement or being interviewed.
